



TIPS for HOME SAFETY

Be House Smart - Play Your Part

“000” –

This emergency number should be on the first speed dial button of your phone. If no speed dial, put a “000” sticker on your phone as a prompt in a high stress situation. Teach your children to use it.

Kitchen Appliances –

Kitchen appliances should be marked (engraved) for identification. Keep a record of the serial numbers on the property inventory form available from your Neighbourhood Watch coordinator.

Mobile Phone, Wallet, etc –

Wallets, purses, mobile phones and other small items of value should be placed out of sight and not on convenient surfaces such as a coffee table or bench top. If it's convenient for you it's also convenient for thieves.

House and Car Keys –

Keep keys safe and out of sight. If left lying around a burglar may take them and gain access to your car and to your house at a later time. If stolen, all of your locks (and your car ignition) will have to be changed.

Key Rack –

A key rack may be convenient for you, but it's also convenient for thieves.
